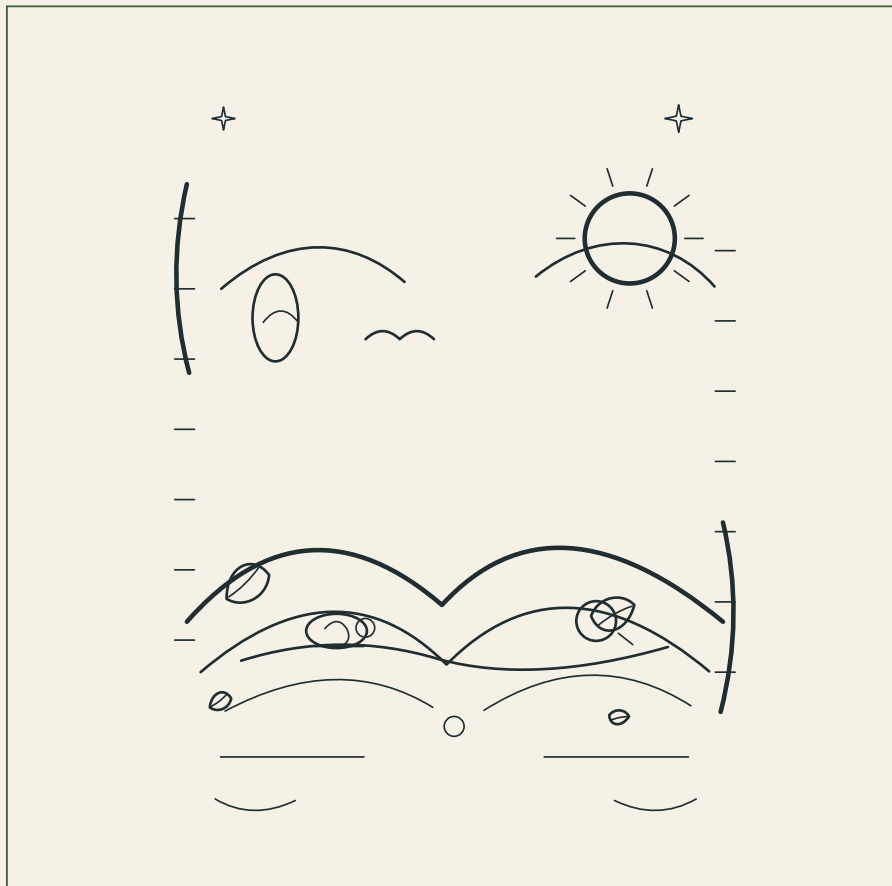
You do not have to keep going. We can put the sheet down, move, get water, or sit with a trusted adult.

REFERENCE

Genesis 1:31

PARAPHRASE

God looked at creation and called it very good.
CONTEXT

Scene: Leaves, sun, bird, snail, and stream
form an open creation still life. Context:
Genesis 1 celebrates God's work without
claiming every circumstance is easy or fair.

REFLECTION

Color, trace, listen, or pass while an
adult names one part of creation and
reads the surrounding passage.

PROMPT

What part of the world can you notice
without pretending every part is easy or
fair?

IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Leaves, a sun, a bird, and a snail beside a
stream.

Stars and wonder

CONTEXT

Scene: A moon, scattered stars, low hills, and
a small telescope leave generous white space.

Context: Psalm 8 moves from the heavens to
human dignity before God.

REFLECTION

An adult can read the psalm, describe
the drawing, and offer a question
without asking for a private story.

PROMPT

What question or wonder would you like
to carry to God?

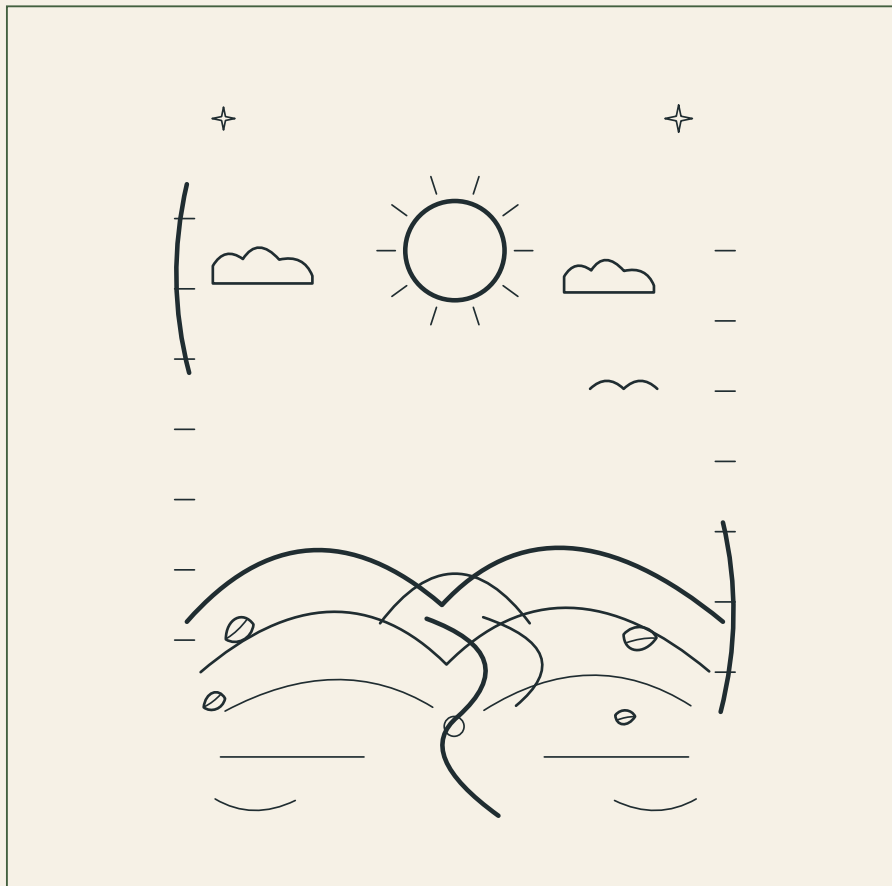
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

PARAPHRASE

The heavens and skies point beyond
themselves to God's glory.

CONTEXT

Scene: Sunrise, clouds, hills, and a winding
river use broad contours instead of dense
detail. Context: Psalm 19 describes creation's
witness before it turns to God's instruction.

REFLECTION

Keep the sky unfilled, trace one
contour, or listen while an adult
connects the image with the whole
psalm.

PROMPT

What does the sky invite you to notice
today?

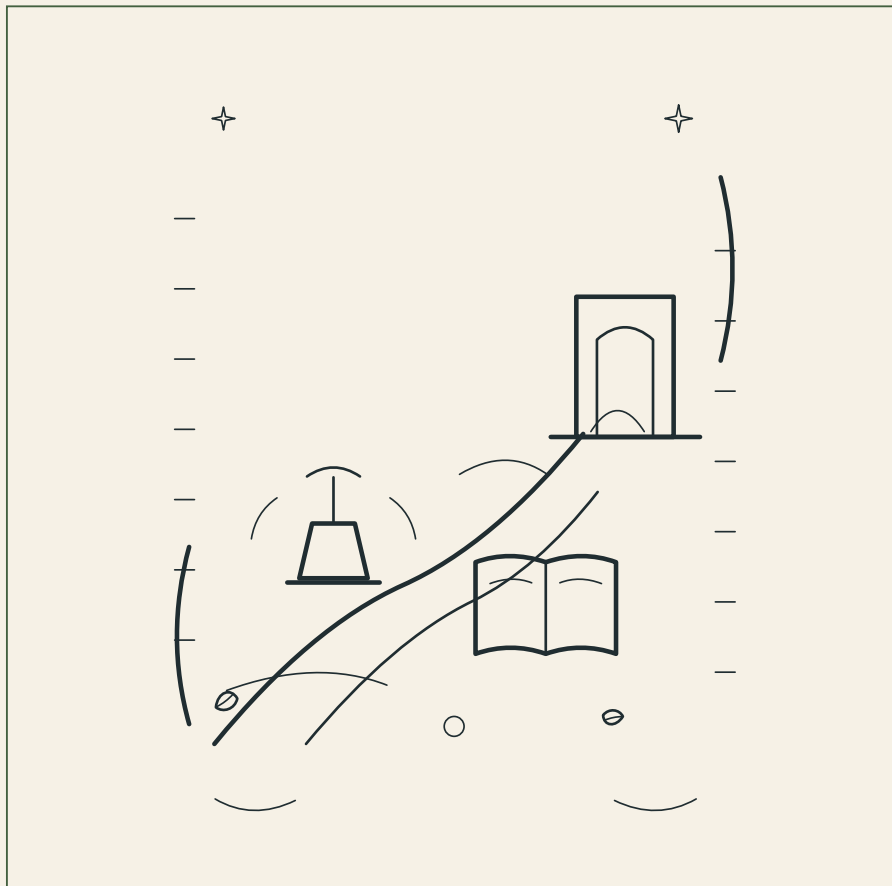
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

PARAPHRASE

God's word can be a lamp for the next step.
CONTEXT

REFLECTION

Read the reference in context, then
offer practical help alongside prayer
rather than promising a perfect route.
PROMPT

What is one next step that needs wise
help?

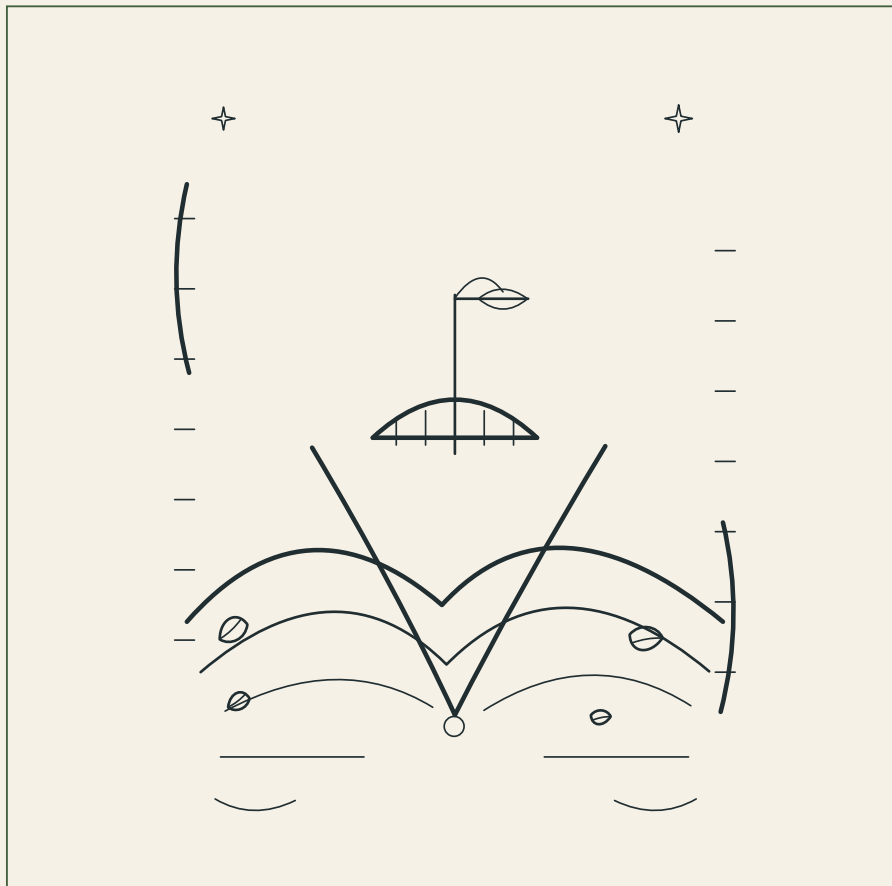
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Trust and ask

PARAPHRASE

Trust God, seek wisdom, and let your path be guided; do not pretend you know everything alone.

CONTEXT

Scene: Two equal paths meet a bridge and plain signpost, with no route marked as guaranteed. Context: Proverbs offers wisdom poetry, not a promise of an easy choice.

REFLECTION

An adult can name a trustworthy helper and invite drawing, listening, AAC, or a pass instead of a personal disclosure.

PROMPT

Who is a trustworthy person to ask when a choice is hard?

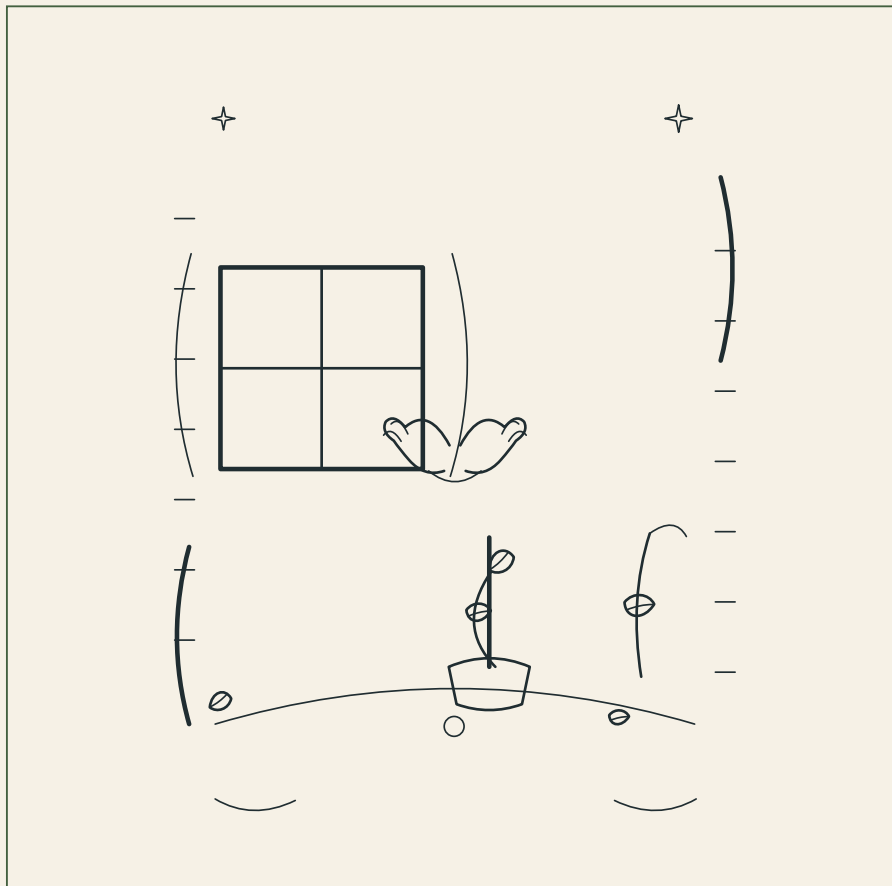

CONTEXT

comfort to a vulnerable people; it does not
replace safety planning.

REFLECTION

Use a verbal description or one shape if
hand imagery is not useful. Keep
practical support visible beside the
reference.

PROMPT

What kind of help can a trusted adult
offer today?

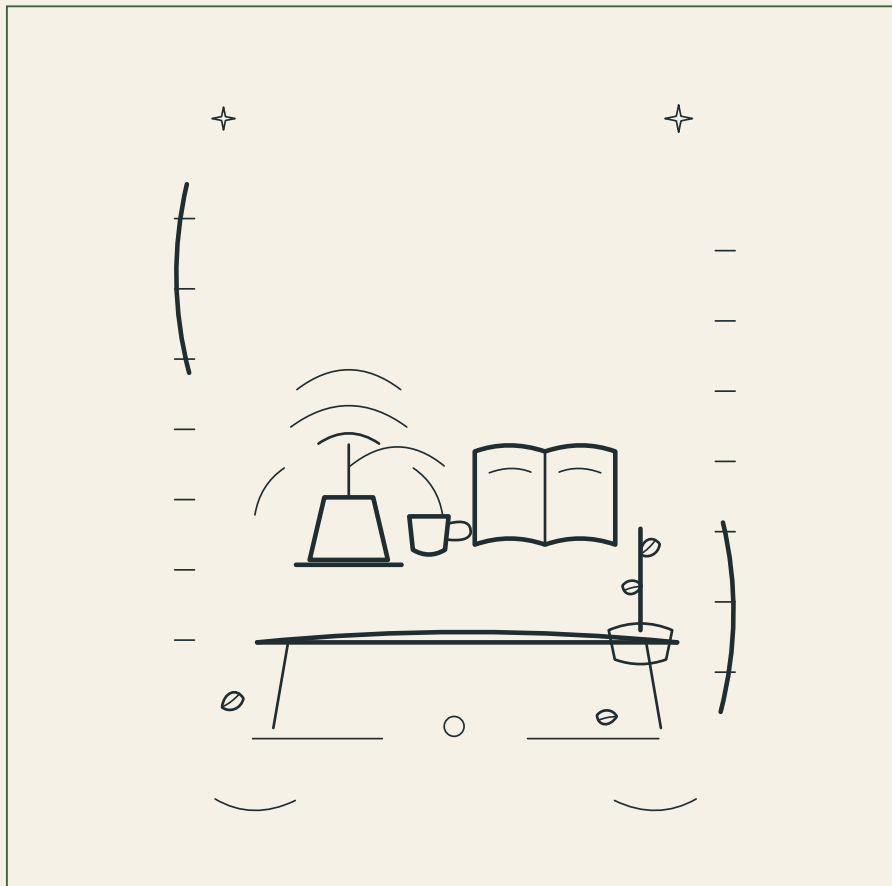
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

REFLECTION

An adult can connect one safe kindness with the passage while allowing a child to listen, move, or stop.

PROMPT

What small, safe kindness could be visible today?

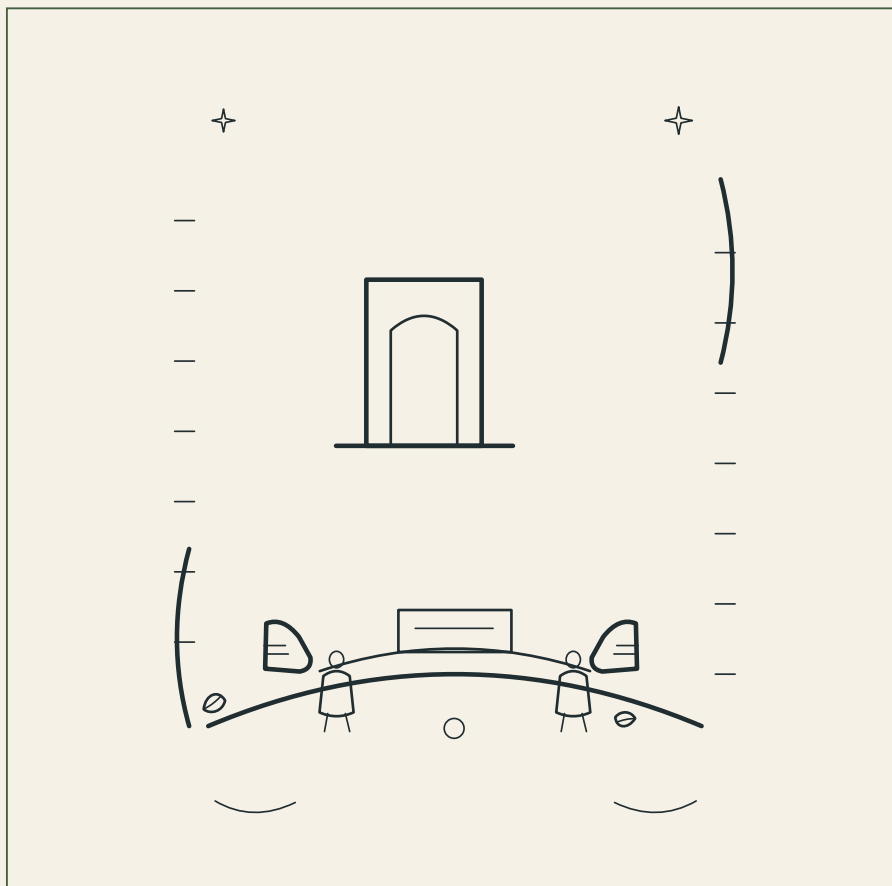
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

CONTEXT

Scene: An open doorway, varied shoes, welcome mat, and adult silhouettes show room without singling out a child. Context: Mark presents Jesus receiving children against the disciples' interruption.

REFLECTION

Offer a pointing or AAC route and discuss welcome without requiring touch, eye contact, or a spoken answer.

PROMPT

What helps a place feel welcoming without requiring anyone to speak or touch?

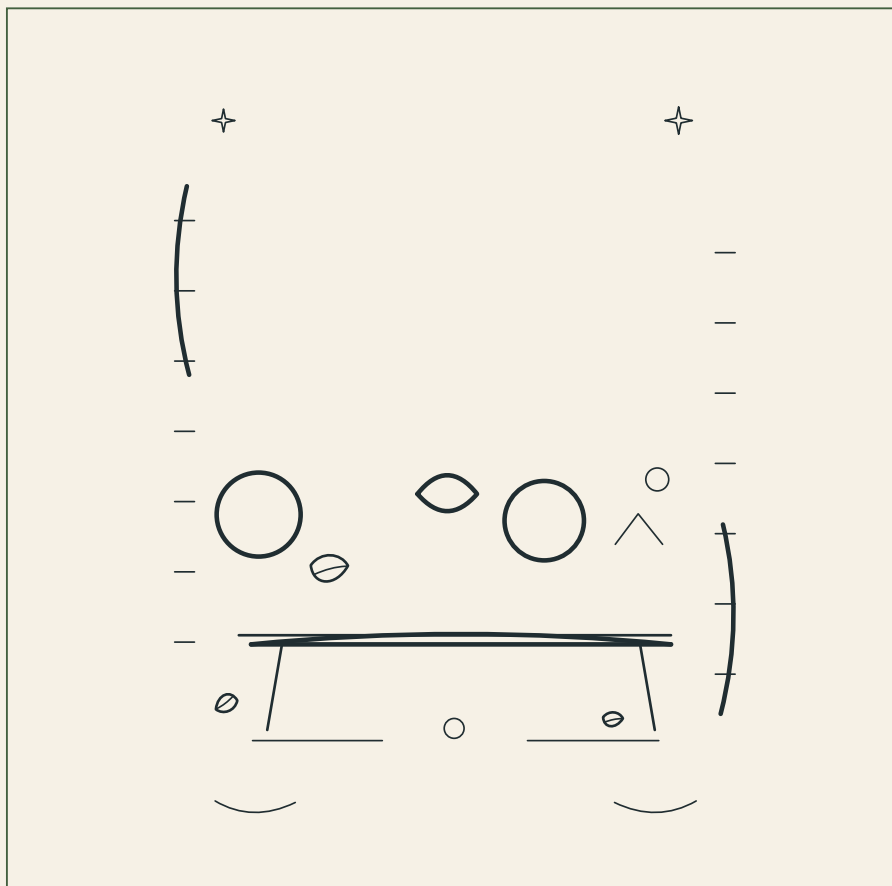
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Open doorway, varied shoes, geometric welcome mat, and simple adult silhouettes without facial detail.

REFLECTION

Wordless symbols for truth, kindness, beauty,
music, and careful noticing arranged on a

learning without a required posture. Context:
Colossians connects teaching, song,
gratitude, and community.

REFLECTION

A group can hum, listen, use AAC, or
pass. Keep the reference and its
context in live text below the drawing.

PROMPT

How could a group share a good word
while letting someone listen or pass?

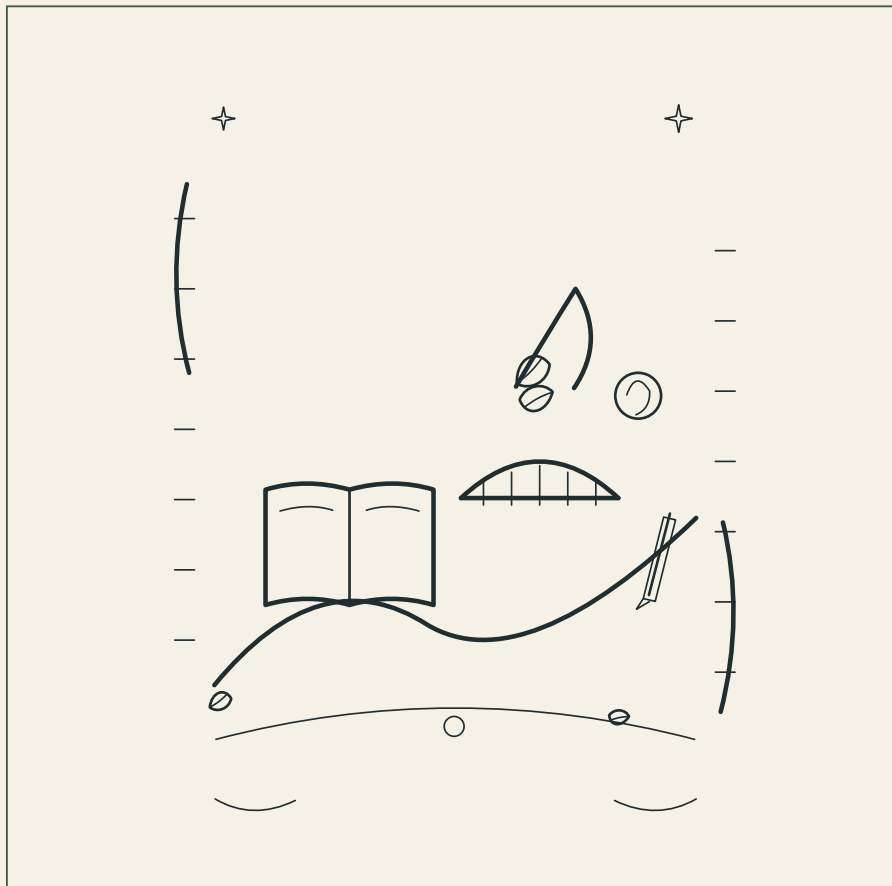
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

REFLECTION

Name one safe adult who can help with a hard question, without asking a child to share private details.

PROMPT

What question could you bring to a trustworthy adult?

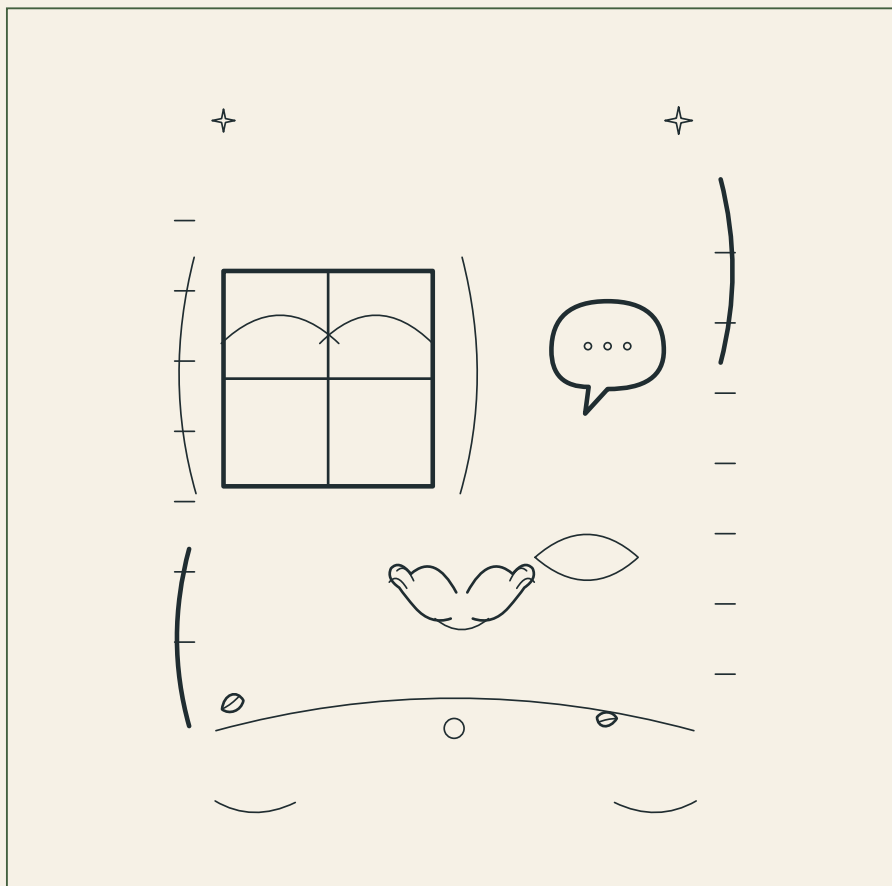
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

suffering.

REFLECTION

Invite a gesture, symbol, AAC
response, or listening route. Do not
treat an impression as a private
message from God.

PROMPT

What helps you communicate when
words are not available?

Open window, moving curtains, wordless
speech bubble, and abstract open hands in
generous white space.
