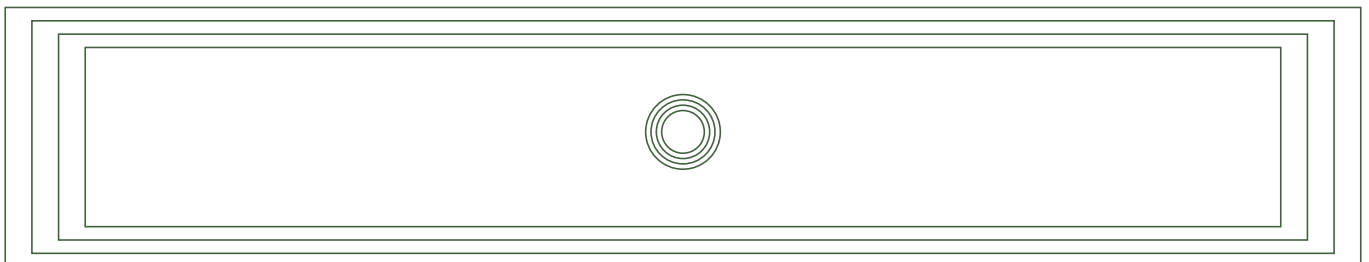

STOP ANY TIME

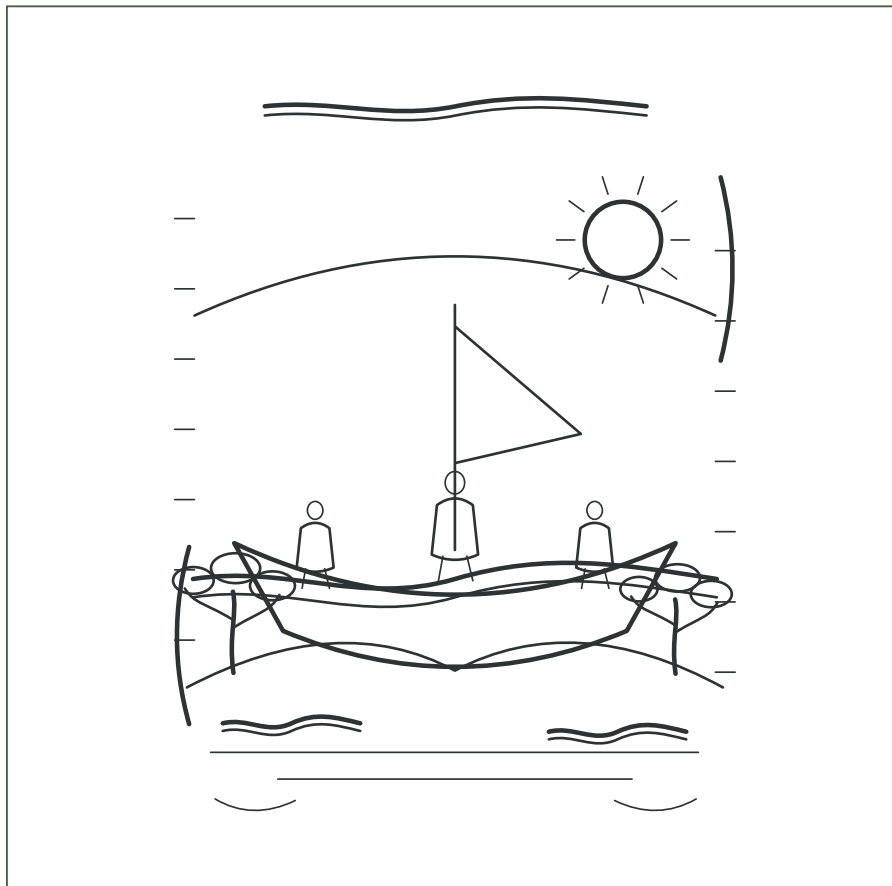
You do not have to keep going. We can stop, move, get water, or sit with a trusted adult.

REFERENCE

Mark 4:35-36

PARAPHRASE

The group leaves shore together because
Jesus invites the crossing to continue.

CONTEXT

Mark begins with an ordinary crossing after
teaching, before the weather changes.

REFLECTION

Notice the boat, shore, and open sky. A
child can color, point, listen, move, or
pass.

PROMPT

What do you notice before the weather
changes? You may color, point, listen,
or pass.

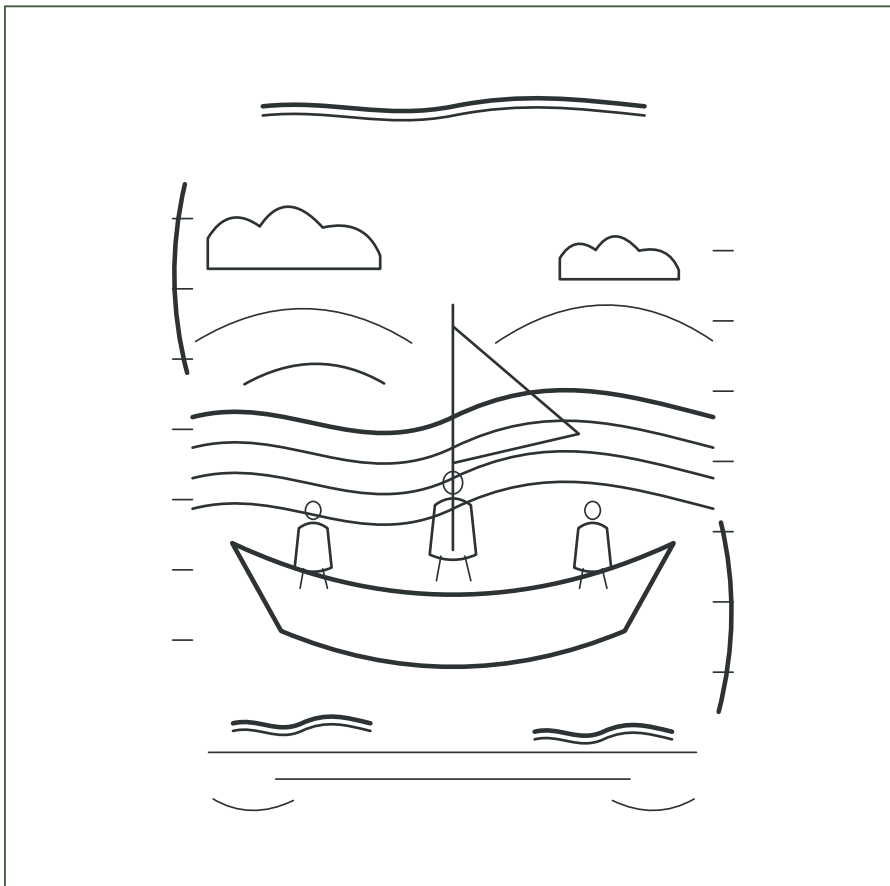
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Small boat carrying Jesus and diverse
disciples leaving a quiet shore under a wide
sky.

Wind rises

REFERENCE

Mark 4:37
PARAPHRASE

A strong wind makes the waves rise and fills
the boat with a serious problem.

CONTEXT

The rising wind changes an ordinary crossing
into a tense scene; the sequence lets an adult
pause.

REFLECTION

Name the changing lines and let the
adult set the pace. A child can color,
listen, move, or pass.

PROMPT

Which lines show movement? Trace a
water line, choose a color, or pass; do
not act out danger.

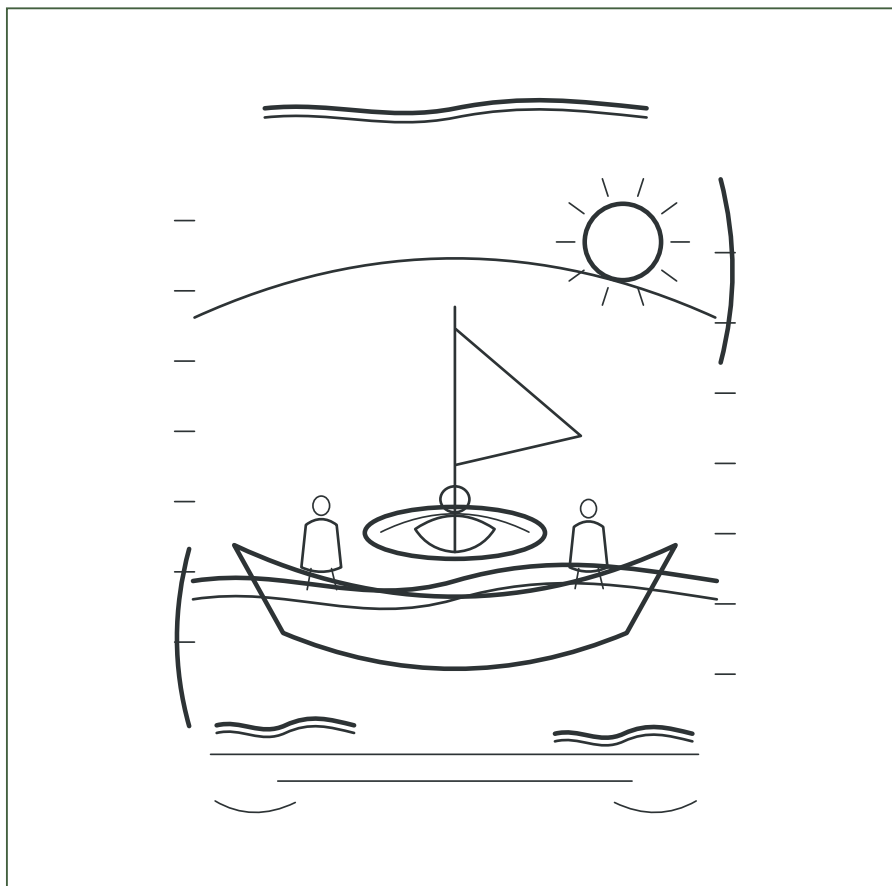
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Boat on high curving waves beneath wind
lines and angled clouds.

Jesus rests

REFERENCE

Mark 4:38a
PARAPHRASE

Jesus is resting while the others see how
serious the waves have become.

CONTEXT

The sleeping figure makes the disciples'
urgency visible and gives the adult a chance
to name rest without blame.

REFLECTION

Point to where each person is looking,
or offer color, AAC, quiet, and a pass
without requiring an explanation.

PROMPT

Where is each person looking? You
may point, color, use AAC, or pass.

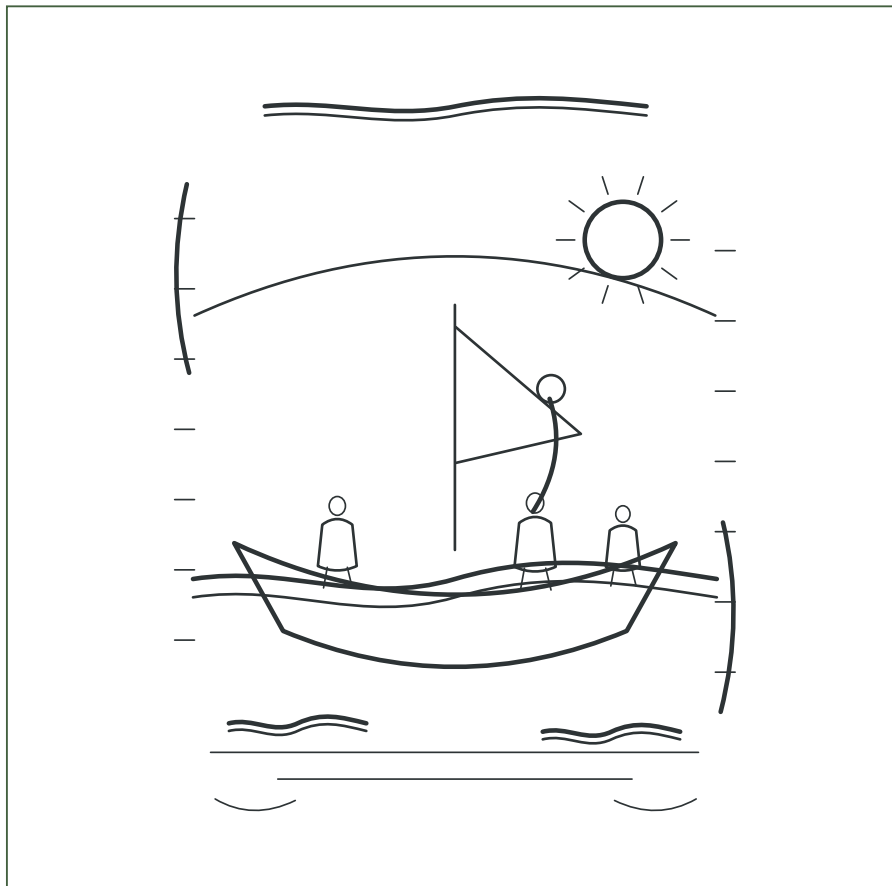
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Jesus rests on a cushion in a rocking boat
while disciples look toward the waves.

A call for help

REFERENCE

Mark 4:38b
PARAPHRASE

The disciples ask Jesus for help because they
are frightened by the danger.

CONTEXT

The request for help shows the disciples
bringing their concern to Jesus.

REFLECTION

Invite the adult to name the story's
help-seeking moment. A child can
point, color, use AAC, or pass.

PROMPT

The story includes a request for help.
Who can help in a real emergency?

Adults answer with local plans.

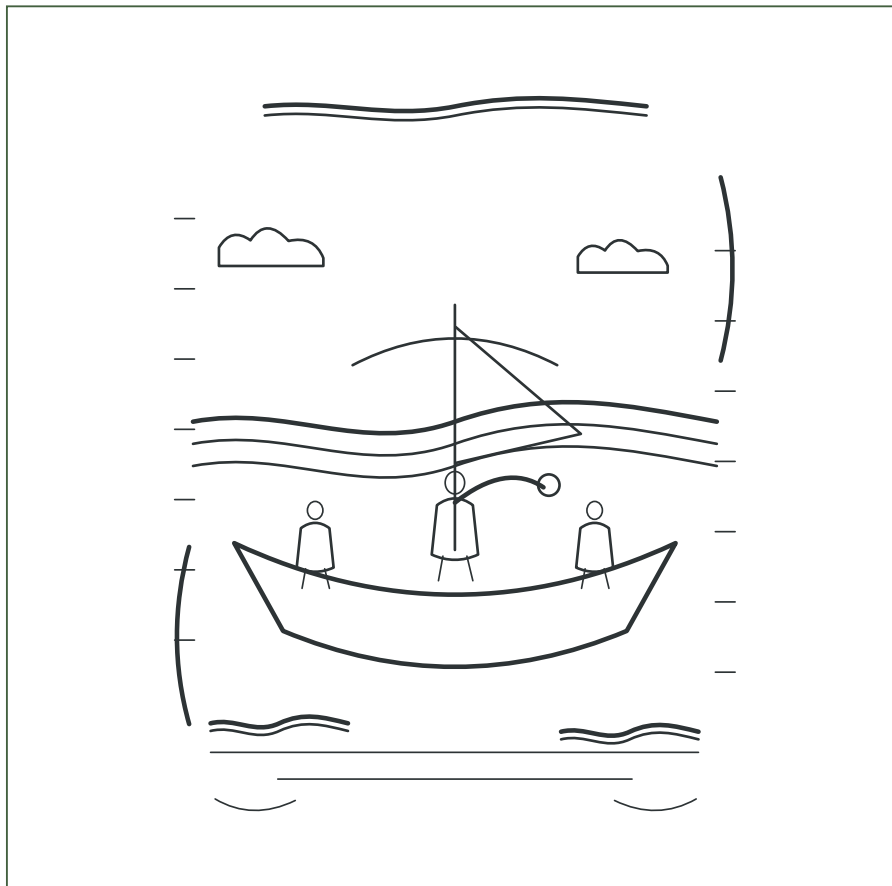
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Disciple raises an open hand to wake Jesus
while others hold the boat rail.

Wind and water quiet

REFERENCE

Mark 4:39-40
PARAPHRASE

Jesus speaks to the wind and water, and the story says the lake becomes quiet before a question about fear.

CONTEXT

The Gospel turns from wind to quiet water and asks what the disciples notice.

REFLECTION

Compare the open water lines with sheet two. A child can listen, draw, move, or pass.

PROMPT

What changes from sheet 2 to sheet 5?
Compare the lines, listen, draw, move, or pass.

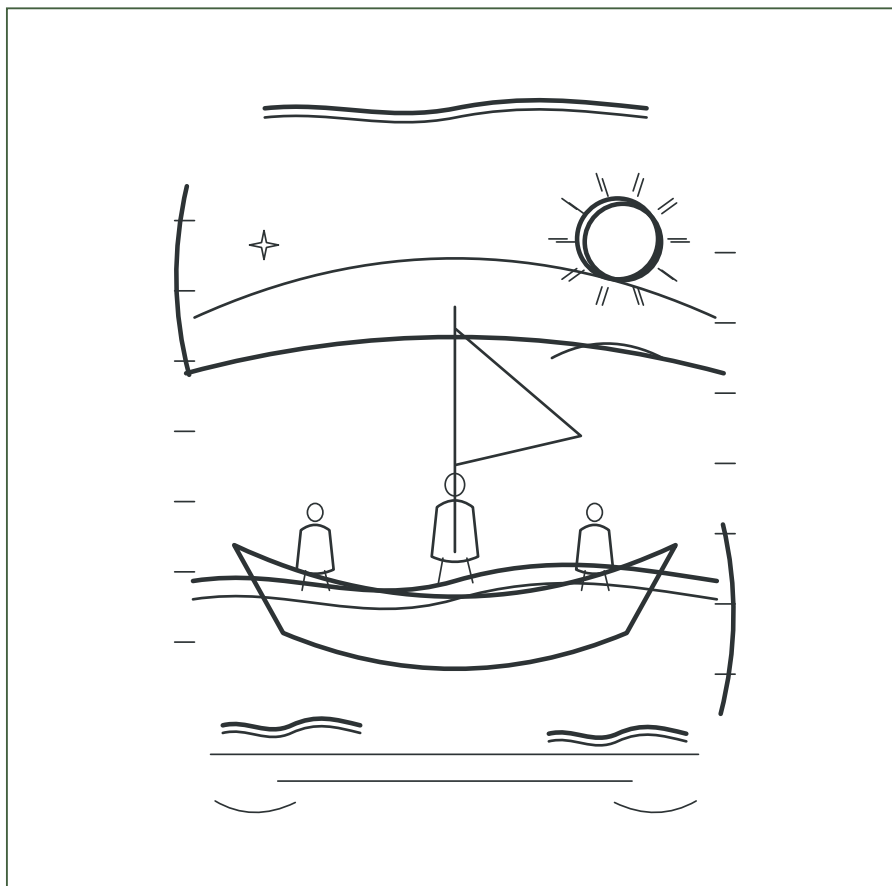
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Jesus gestures toward water as broad waves settle beneath an opening sky.

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A wondering question

REFERENCE

Mark 4:41
PARAPHRASE

The disciples are amazed and ask one another who Jesus is after seeing the calm.
CONTEXT

Mark ends with an open question, leaving room for adult-led wondering.

REFLECTION

Offer the question as a choice for wondering; a child can answer with color, movement, listening, or a pass.
PROMPT

You may wonder with the disciples, choose a color, write a fictional question, or pass.

IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Disciples sit together in a quiet boat and look toward Jesus and an open horizon.
