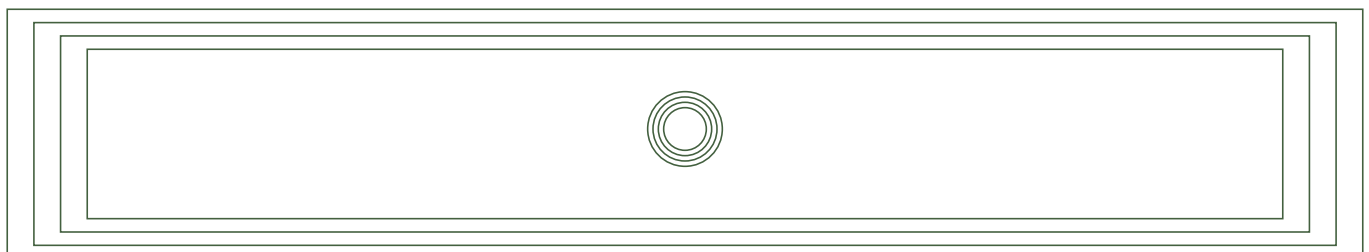

STOP ANY TIME

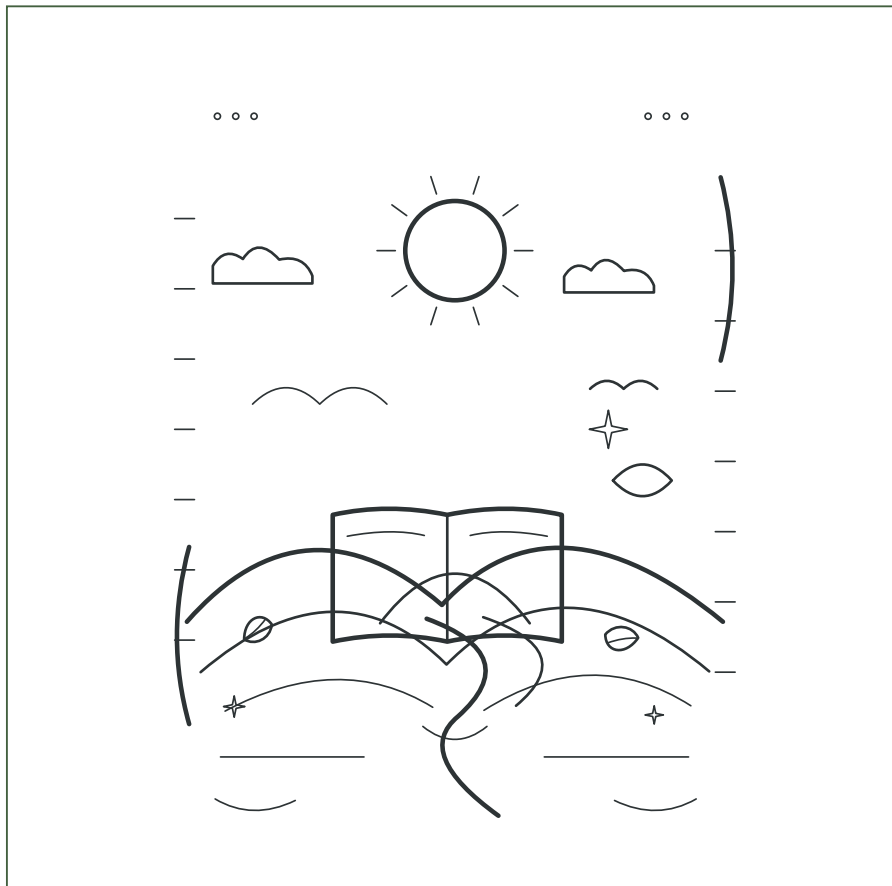
You do not have to keep going. We can put the sheet down, move, get water, or sit with a trusted adult.

REFERENCE

Psalm 100
PARAPHRASE

Give thanks and praise God with gladness,
while making room for a real range of feelings.
CONTEXT

Scene: A hillside, open wordless songbook,
sun, and music notes create an uncluttered
praise setting. Context: Psalm 100 is a
communal song of thanksgiving and does not
require a person to perform happiness.

REFLECTION

An adult may read the psalm, hum,
point, use AAC, draw, listen, or pass.
Keep praise invitational rather than
demanding a response.

PROMPT

What kind of praise feels possible
today: words, music, drawing, listening,
or quiet?

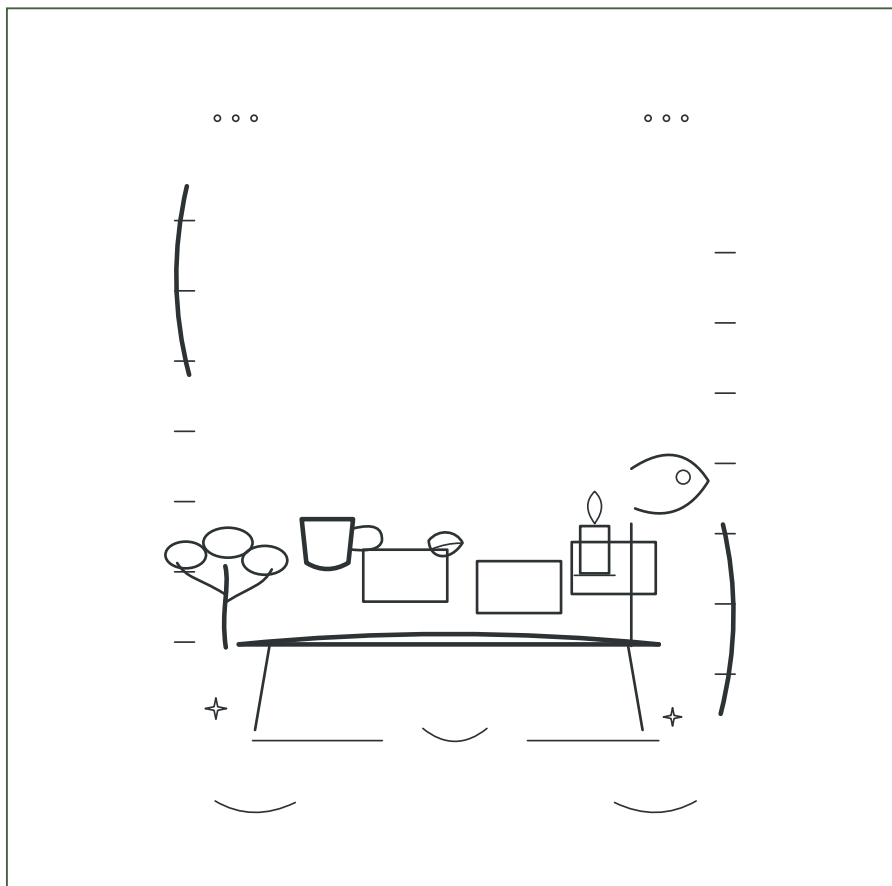

Thankful in every season

REFERENCE

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

PARAPHRASE

Keep praying and look for gratitude without pretending a hard season is good or deserved.

CONTEXT

Scene: A table, warm mug, leaf, candle, and blank cards leave space for different kinds of response. Context: Paul calls the church to rejoice, pray, and give thanks within ordinary communal life.

REFLECTION

Invite one safe noticing, or offer listening and a pass. Gratitude can sit beside sadness, anger, uncertainty, and a need for practical care.

PROMPT

What is one small thing you can notice without forcing yourself to feel cheerful?

IMAGE DESCRIPTION

A warm mug, leaf, small candle, and three blank cards rest on a table.

Ask and give thanks

PARAPHRASE

Bring requests to God with honest thanks,
while trusted adults also help with concrete
needs.

CONTEXT

Scene: Open hands, plain bowl, star, and
wordless note card make room for asking and
thanking. Context: Philippians joins prayer,
petition, and thanksgiving; it does not promise
that every request receives the hoped-for
answer.

REFLECTION

An adult can name a practical next
step, read the verse, and offer speech,
writing, drawing, AAC, silence, or a
pass.

PROMPT

Is there something to ask for,
something to thank God for, or both?

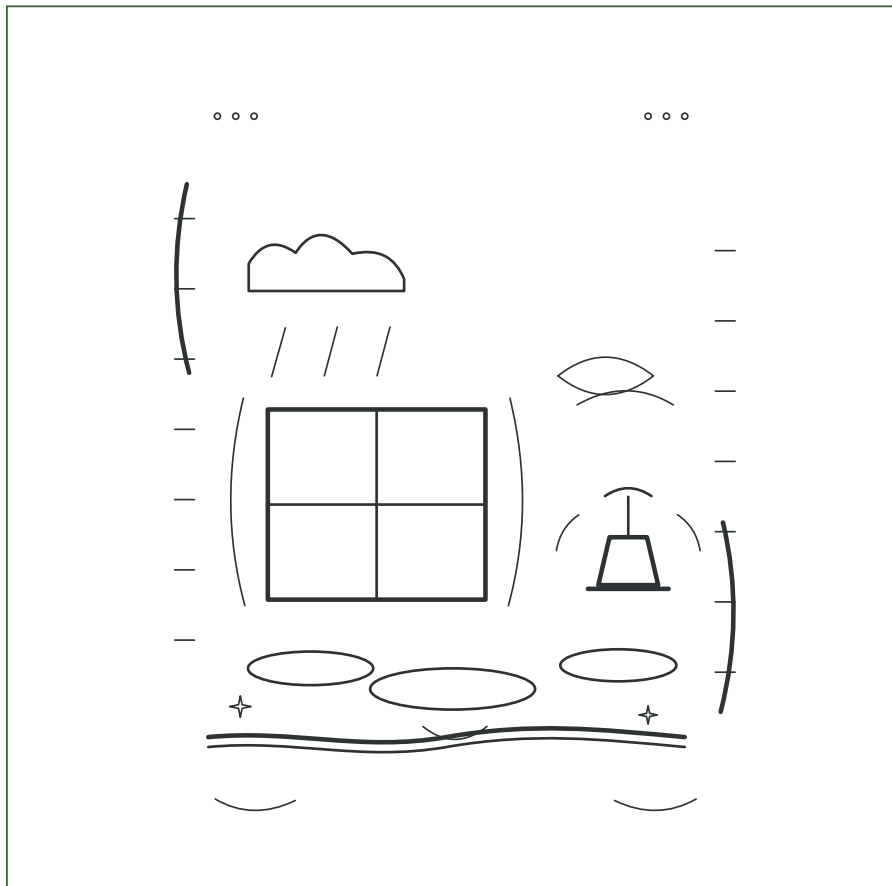

REFERENCE

Psalm 13
PARAPHRASE

A prayer can ask how long and still keep
turning toward God when waiting hurts.
CONTEXT

Scene: Rain cloud, window, puddles, and a
steady lamp hold lament without a quick
answer. Context: Psalm 13 moves through
complaint, request, and trust; it gives
permission for honest prayer.

REFLECTION

Read the psalm slowly and let silence,
tears, movement, drawing, or a pass be
enough. Seek practical support when a
concern affects safety or daily life.

PROMPT

What would you want a trusted adult to
understand while you wait?

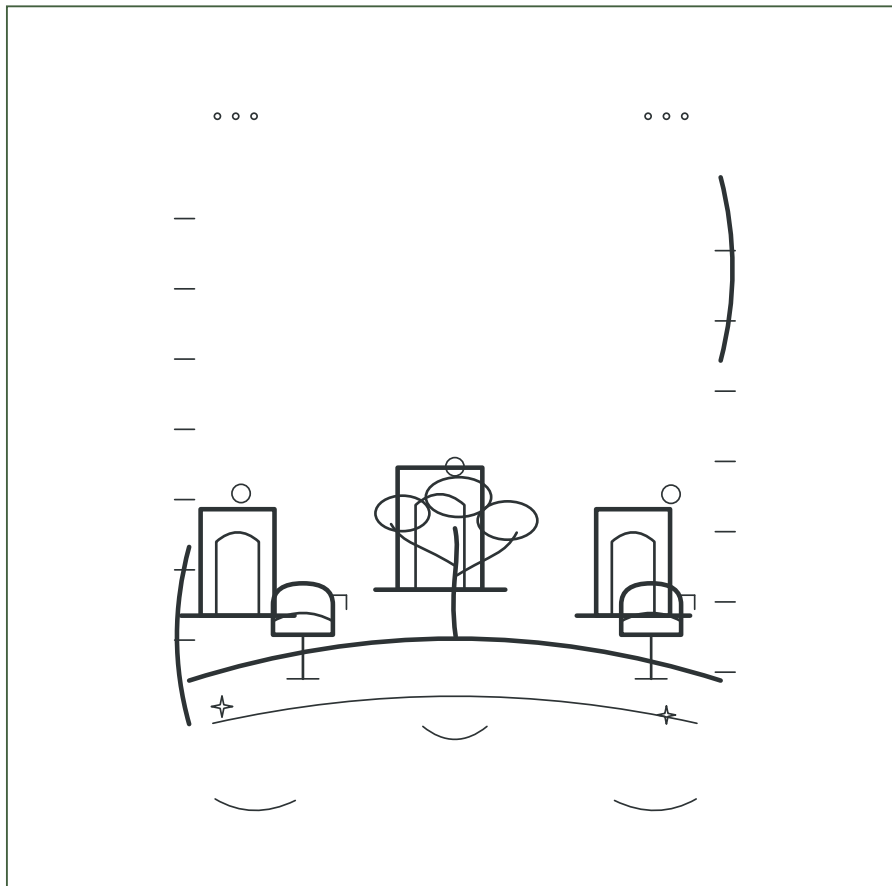

REFERENCE

1 Timothy 2:1
PARAPHRASE

Offer prayers for other people and leaders,
while respecting privacy and choosing safe,
specific care.

CONTEXT

Scene: Three varied homes, a path, tree, and
open mailbox show a neighborhood without
names or identifying details. Context: 1
Timothy asks the church to make prayers and
intercessions for all people.

REFLECTION

An adult can choose a broad group,
such as neighbors or helpers, without
collecting a child's private information or
asking for disclosure.

PROMPT

Who could receive a quiet prayer or a
safe act of care today?

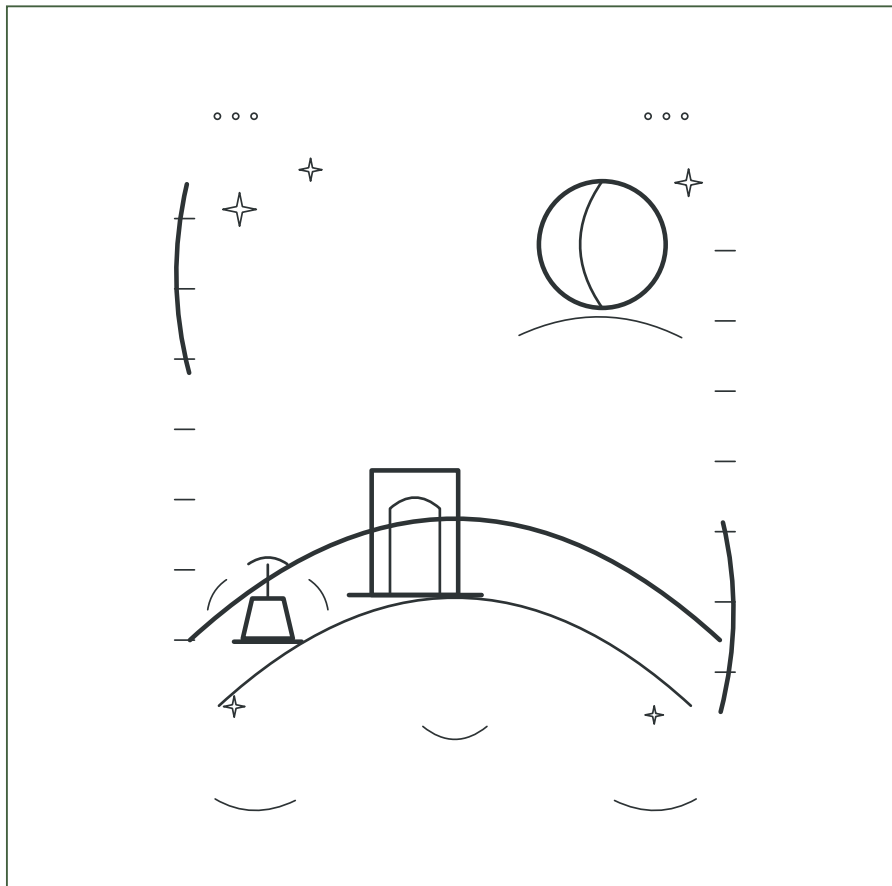
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Watch and wait

REFERENCE

Habakkuk 2:1
PARAPHRASE

A watchful prayer can wait for understanding
without forcing an answer or ignoring a
present need.

CONTEXT

Scene: Lookout hill, open doorway, moon, and
lantern create a patient waiting image.

Context: Habakkuk describes a prophet
standing watch and listening for a word amid
public injustice.

REFLECTION

Offer a short pause, a read-aloud, or a
moving and drawing route. Waiting in
prayer never replaces seeking help for
an urgent concern.

PROMPT

What would help you wait for wisdom
while still receiving support now?

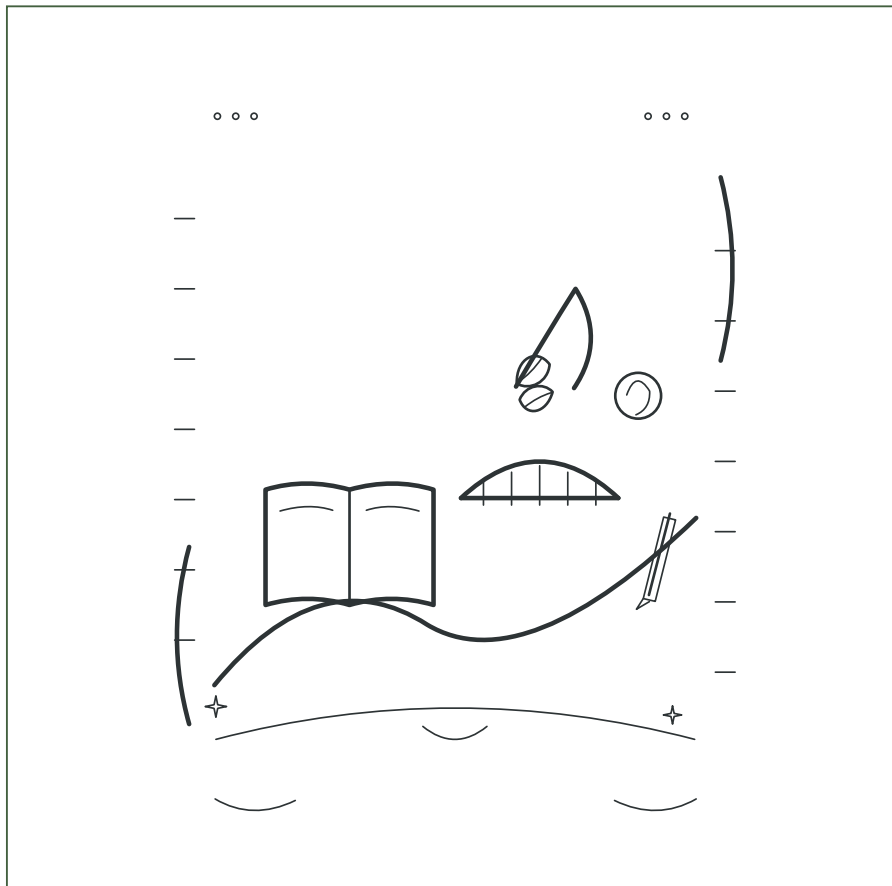
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

REFERENCE

James 1:5
PARAPHRASE

Ask God for wisdom and ask knowledgeable,
trustworthy people for help with a difficult
question.

CONTEXT

Scene: Leafy question mark, open book,
pencil, and bridge point toward help without
writing a fixed answer. Context: James
commends asking for wisdom amid testing
and responsible action.

REFLECTION

Invite a spoken question, pointing,
AAC, drawing, listening, or a pass.
Keep the adult responsible for checking
facts and safety.

PROMPT

What question could you bring to God
and a trustworthy adult?

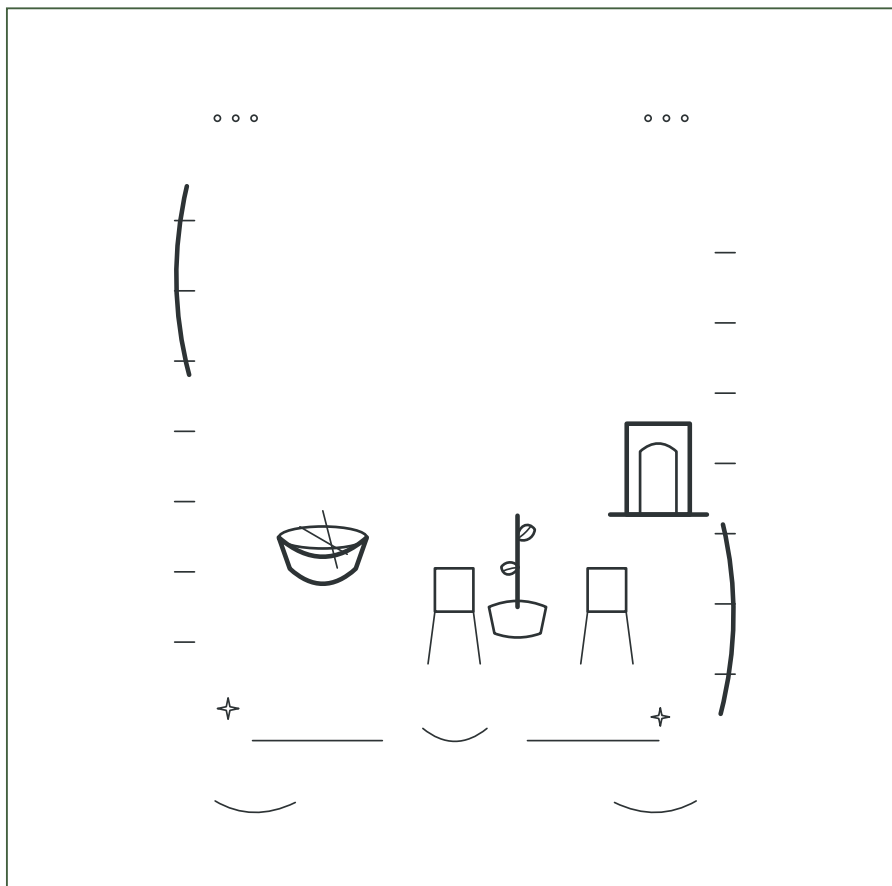

Mercy and repair

REFERENCE

Ephesians 4:32

PARAPHRASE

Practice kindness and forgiveness with wise boundaries; repair does not require unsafe contact or instant trust.

CONTEXT

Scene: Mended bowl, separate chairs, plant, and open doorway show repair with space.

Context: Ephesians calls the church to kindness and forgiveness while its wider letter addresses truthful, communal living.

REFLECTION

An adult can model an apology, boundary, or safe repair step. Do not require contact, disclosure, or reconciliation where harm or danger is present.

PROMPT

What kind boundary or repair step would be safe and honest?

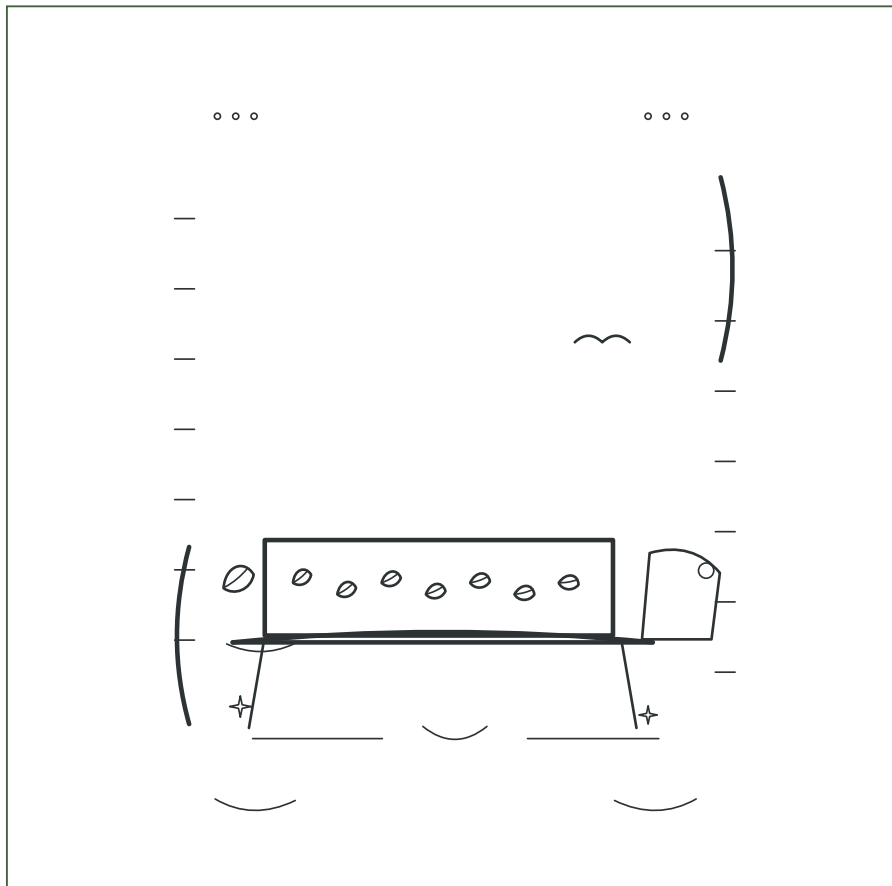
IMAGE DESCRIPTION

PARAPHRASE

Care for the place we share and love
neighbors through small, safe acts of
attention.

CONTEXT

Scene: Garden bed, watering can, bird, and
compost leaves connect care for creation with
care for people. Context: Genesis 2:15
describes tending a garden, while Jesus
names love of neighbor as a central
command.

REFLECTION

Choose a manageable act, such as
watering a plant with an adult or leaving
a kind note. Participation can be
watching, drawing, or passing.

PROMPT

What small act could care for a shared
place or a neighbor?

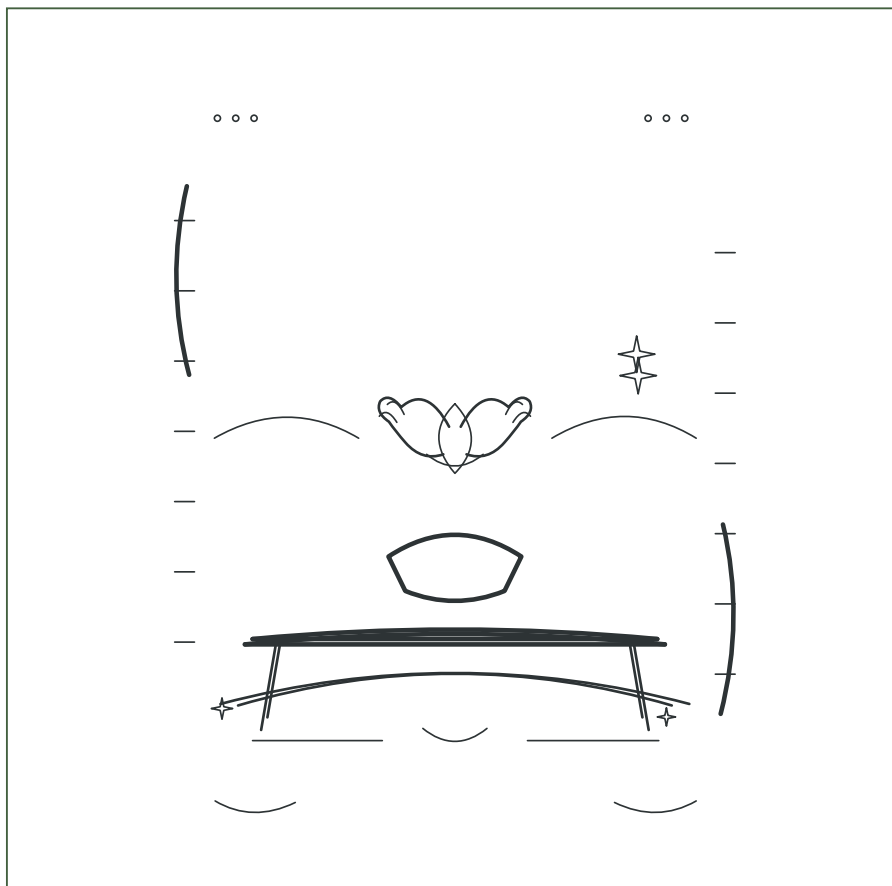

PARAPHRASE

Jesus teaches a prayer for God's name, daily provision, forgiveness, guidance, and rescue from harm.

CONTEXT

Scene: Open hands, table, daily loaf, path, and star frame a blank center for live text.

Context: Jesus gives this prayer within teaching about public religious performance and trust in God's care.

REFLECTION

Read one line at a time in live HTML text. A person may speak, point, use AAC, listen, move, draw, or pass without reciting the whole prayer.

PROMPT

Which line of the prayer would you like to hear, notice, or leave open today?

IMAGE DESCRIPTION

Open hands, table, daily loaf, path, and star arranged around a blank central prayer space.
